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### **Course Materials**

A number of acting methods have been created over the past 135 years that attempt to guide the actor to the creation of a convincing performance that captivates an audience. This course uses a hybrid approach of multiple acting training techniques, primarily on an understanding and application of Stanislavski's *Method of Physical Action* and *System* and some stylistic "descendants" (e.g., Strasberg's *Method* acting, Hagan's *Six Steps*, the Atlantic School's *Practical Aesthetics*, and others). Students will read and perform scenes from multiple plays throughout the semester while applying an intellectual and physical discipline through an actor's analysis of the text and control of voice/emotion/body in the creation of a character. Lecture material will be supplemented and reinforced with in class exercises.
